Motion by Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Driskell to approve Ordinance No. 4099 – An Ordinance Amending 6-4-3-1 and 6-4-1 of Taylorville City Code (re: adding no parking on South side of Pleasant Street between Cherokee and Cottage Streets; and adding stop sign on southeast corner of Pauline and Powers Streets). Roll Call – Aldermen Brown, Bryant, Budd, Dorchinecz, Driskell, Olive, Skultety, Wilson, and Mayor Barry voted YEA. The Mayor announced the motion carried.

### ORDINANCE NO. 4100 – AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE CITY OF TAYLORVILLE (ie. TAYLORVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT SCBAs)

Motion by Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Brown to approve Ordinance No. 4100 – An Ordinance Authorizing the Sale of Personal Property Owned by the City of Taylorville (i.e. Taylorville Fire Department SCBAs). Roll Call – Aldermen Brown, Bryant, Budd, Dorchinecz, Driskell, Olive, Skultety, Wilson, and Mayor Barry voted YEA. The Mayor announced the motion carried.

#### DEPUTY TREASURER OFFICE SPACE

Discussion was held regarding the optimal office space for the Deputy Treasurer. Alderman Olive had presented quotes to the Public Facilities Committee from several contractors to build a space directly behind the City Treasurer's Office in the vault area shared by the Treasurer and the Water Department. The most reasonable quote was from Bradco Inc. for \$7,612.00, along with a quote from Morrison Electric for \$1,070.33 and CTI for \$1,816.44. Total cost was \$10,498.77. Aldermen Skultety and Driskell expressed concern for the expenditure of taxpayer funds to create another office space and suggested HBO/Airport Manager Goodall move his office to the airport and then utilize this space for the Deputy Treasurer. Alderman Olive said he plans to create office space at the Gagne building for Andy Goodall, as there are three offices available there, and utilize the current office for the Police Department due to it's proximity to the department. Motion by Alderman Olive and seconded by Alderman Budd to accept the quote from Bradco, Inc., Morrison Electric, and CTI in the amount of \$10,498.77 for Deputy Treasurer Office space to be built in the vault area behind the Treasurer's Office. Roll Call — Aldermen Brown, Budd, Dorchinecz, Olive, and Wilson voted YEA. Aldermen Bryant, Driskell, and Skultety voted NAY. The Mayor announced the motion carried.

#### SPECIAL EVENTS PERMIT - RED BLAND LITTLE LEAGUE PARADE

Motion by Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Dorchinecz to approve the request and grant a Special Events Permit for the Red Bland Little League Parade to be held at 10:00 A.M. on Saturday, April 23, 2022 on the Square. The motion carried (8-0).

<u>PUBLIC HEARING – SPECIAL USE FOR ADULT-USE CANNABIS DISPENSING ORGANIZATION</u> Motion by Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Budd to set a Public Hearing and Plan Commission Meeting to review An Odinance Adding a New Chapter 16 to Title 10 of the Taylorville City Code (re: Special Use for Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organization) on May 2, 2022. City Attorney Romano noted that the sample Ordinance will need to be completed by the Ordinance Committee regarding specifics and parameters regarding the dispensary. Motion by Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Budd to amend the previous motion and set the Public Hearing and Plan Commission Meeting for May 16, 2022 to allow for the proper publication time. The motion carried (7-1).
