VEHICLE REPLACEMENT

Fire Chief Adermann discussed the need to replace the Expedition and Brush Truck as part of the Capital Management Plan. He explained there are no replacements available at this time for the Brush Truck. The Committee was provided with a quote from Bob Ridings for a 2023 Dodge Durango for \$44,138.00; a quote for the Equipment Cabinet for rear from 1st In Emergency Products for \$4,687.50; and was advised the estimated cost to equip the vehicle with Warning Lights and Sirens is \$3,000.00.

Motion by Alderman Driskell and seconded by Alderman Skultety to recommend to the City Council to approve the Fire Department to purchase a 2023 Dodge Durango from Bob Ridings at a cost of \$44,138.00; to purchase the Equipment Cabinet for rear from 1st In Emergency Products at a cost of \$4,687.50, and to equipment the vehicle with Warning Lights and Sirens at a cost of \$3,000.00, for a total cost not to exceed \$51,825.50, to be paid from the Equipment Line item in the FY 2022/2023 Budget.

Motion carried 4-0.

He advised there was no improvement in the Emergency Communications area at this time as incorrect information was submitted by the Emergency Communications Center.

Once the correct information is submitted, he expects the overall PPC Grade to move up from a 4 to a 3. He explained this grade affects the pricing for a variety of personal and commercial insurance coverages. The price of property insurance in a community with a good PPC is lower than in a community with a poor PPC.
