Discuss Laborer Position - Municipal Building

AFSCME Union President Derek McConnell expressed the need to have a full time laborer at the Municipal Building and distributed a detailed list of job duties. Chairman Driskell believes there is a need to fill the position but does not think full time is needed. Alderman Olive agreed, while Alderman Bryant and Alderman Skultey are in favor of having a full time laborer and believe there is enough work to justify this.

Motion by Alderman Skultety and seconded by Alderman Bryant to recommend to the City Council to fill the full time Laborer at the Municipal Building. Motion tied 2-2. Chairman Driskell advised to send this to full Council for everyone to vote.

Any Other Matters

Mayor Barry explained of an IDNR Grant that is available for updates to the Lake Taylorville Marina area. The grant application is due by September 30th, 2022. Mayor Barry provided an estimate from Benton & Associates in the total of \$1,200,000.00, that included a kayak launch, ADA fishing pier, walking path, ADA beach access, retaining wall, ADA parking, disc golf, basketball and pickleball, ADA pavilion and parking and bath house updates. These are just ideas, and changes can be made. There is no minimum amount to spend for the grant. Mayor Barry requested each Alderman contact him with input on what to keep on the estimate. This is a 50/50 grant.
