PURCHASE DODGE CHARGER FROM MISSOURI HIGHWAY PATROL

Deputy Chief Childers discussed the current inventory of police vehicles advising there are currently 19 vehicles and 22 employees. Five vehicles have over 100,000 miles causing the repair expenditures to increase. Ideally, the department wants to replace one vehicle per year.

Motion by Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Mitchelson to recommend to the City Council to allow the Police Department to purchase a Dodge Charger from the Missouri Highway Patrol and have the necessary equipment installed by Alpha & Omega at a cost not to exceed \$33,000.00 to be paid out of the FY 2023/2024 Equipment Line Item.
